<p>1. Shears</p>  <p>Heavy Duty cutting of fabric. One handle larger than other.</p>	<p>2. Scissors</p>  <p>Used to trim threads. Two handles same size.</p>
<p>3. Pinking Shears</p>  <p>Cuts a zig-zag edge to prevent raveling. Makes a seam finish.</p>	<p>4. Thimble</p>  <p>Protects your finger when hand sewing.</p>



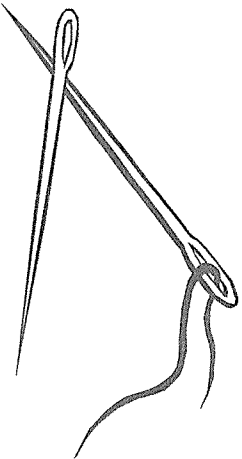
Stores pins, filled with sawdust which sharpens pins.

5. **Pin Cushion**



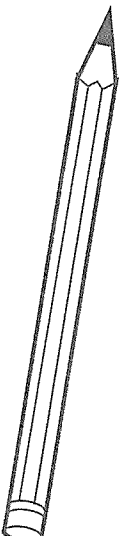
Used to hold pattern to fabric or 2 layers of fabric. Must lay flat on fabric.

6. **Straight Pins**



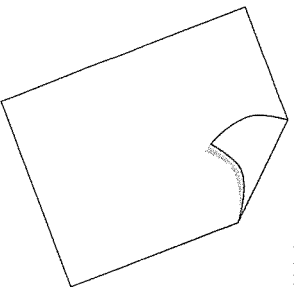
Different sizes and lengths. Used to sew by hand.

7. **Hand Sewing Needle**



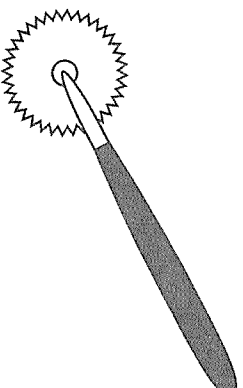
Chalk-filled pencil – makes temporary marks on fabric.

8. **Marking Pencil**



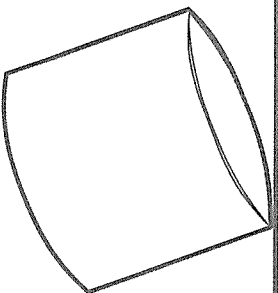
Waxy coated paper which transfers pattern markings.

9. **Tracing Paper**



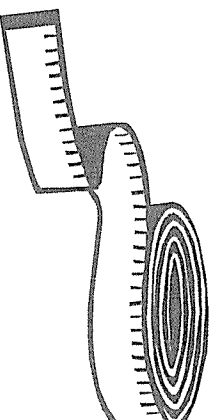
Handle & metal wheel with teeth, used with tracing.

10. **Tracing Wheel**







Square of chalk, makes temporary marks on fabric.

11. **Tailors Chalk**



60" long, takes pattern or body measurements.

12. **Tape Measure**

 <p>6" long with slide, helps you mark a hem or smaller amounts.</p>	 <p>Takes out sewing mistakes.</p>
<p>13. Sewing Gauge</p>  <p>Helps press seams in tubes - like sleeves. Looks like a sausage.</p>	<p>14. Seam Ripper</p>  <p>Press curved areas. Looks like a ham!</p>
<p>15. Seam Roll</p>	<p>16. Pressing Ham</p>
